



Unit 8: Our Future (Environmental Solutions)

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Course Description: This unit was designed to supplement existing science coursework. Students will learn about the various issues our ocean and people that rely on it, are facing. Students will be taught different issues and given the freedom to brainstorm solutions. Those solutions will be discussed in the following unit

Course Objective:

2. Students will gain a better understanding of the natural world.
3. To encourage identifying an issue and problem solving.

Course Work:

Skill Level:

Many activities are labeled Beginner, Medium, or Advanced and it is up to the adult to decide what they would like their student to complete. We recommend the following to evaluate:

- Beginner: Someone new to marine science or is between the ages of 5-8.
- Medium: Someone who has received a moderate amount of science education or between the ages of 9-11.
- Advanced: Someone who is comfortable with more in-depth science topics, mature topics and verbiage, or between the ages of 12-17.
